Number of the week: 10.


Watch this video about our number of the week 10.

Shapes of the week: Circle and sphere.

A sphere is 3D. A circle is 2D. What other facts can you remember about these shapes? Can you find these shapes at home?



Activity: Draw an Easter egg with a line down the middle. Place some small objects on one side, such as counters, smarties or pieces of pasta. Now put the same on the other. The Easter egg will show a double. Use a sentence to talk about your double. For example: 6 is made of 3 and 3, double 3 is 6.

what you know about Easter?


