<u>Topic (Art - History - Geography)</u> <u>Italian Adventure</u> HADRIAN'S WALL

The wall was built by 3 Roman legions (15,000 men) using mostly stone.

It is 73 miles long and runs from east to west across England. It was up to 6 metres high and 3 metres wide! There were 16 forts, 80 hillcastles, 160 turrets and 3 bridges! You can still see a lot of it today.


Activity one -

Hadrian's wall runs through the

counties of Cumbria and Northumberland. Can you locate Hadrian' wall and these counties on a map? Can you name the county we live in? Can you name 3 other counties near to us? Use this map to help if you haven't got one at home.

Activity two -

Can you copy and draw a section of Hadrian's wall like the section below? If you like a challenge, you could even make or build it using different materials – eg card, lego, different sized bottles or containers. We'd love to see some of your photos!

Science – Plants

Over the next four weeks, we are going to carry out an investigation into growing cress. This week you should get all the equipment you need.

1. 2-3 empty yoghurt pots or egg shells to hold the cress. **2.** 2-3 sheets of kitchen roll. **3.** 2-3 balls of cotton wool. **4.** Cress seeds from a supermarket or garden centre. Decorate your pots or eggshells with a face so when the cress grows, it looks like silly green hair. Next week we will actually plant the seeds.

TIP: Alternatively, you could grow something else, such as cucumbers or tomatoes in your empty yoghurt pot. Don't worry if you don't get chance to grow anything- we will post photos each week for you to observe how the crops we have planted are growing.

<u>French-</u> Matching pairs game (play on your own or with a partner)

Practise learning the French colour names by creating a game! On one card, write the French phrase, and on a separate card, scribble the colour using a coloured pencil/felt tip to match the phrase. Once you have done this for all phrases, shuffle the cards together and lay them in rows facing down. Turn over two cards and if they match, you keep them. If they don't match, turn them back over.
