
This is an overview of the main areas of learning in Reception for this week which


Number of the week: 8

Listen to the number 8 song. Can you recall some facts about the number 8?



Shape of the week: Cylinder

A cone is a 3D shape. It has 2 faces. Would it be a good 3D shape to build a tower? Can you think of anything



Activity: Create a large tens frame in the middle of the carpet by using 10 A4 sheets of paper. Count out 6 objects. Place them on the tens frame. Draw attention to filling one line horizontally and place the sixth object on the second line so the children begin to subitise 6 as 5 and 1. Move the 6 objects around and establish that there are still 6. Repeat for numbers 7 and 8, with 7 and 8 objects on the tens frame.

Irresistible Learning Topic: Under the Sea The World/topic

Activity 1: Listen to the story 'Commotion in the Ocean'. What was your favourite animal? Can you remember some facts about the animals?



Activity 2: On Espresso search 'Under the sea' and explore the foundation module. Enjoy exploring the pictures and sound clips.

Activity 3: Listen and sing along to Under the Sea from The Little Mermaid. You can also try joining in with this body percussion version.
