<u>Maths</u>

Oak Academy: Place Value

Lesson 1: identifying tens and ones in a 2-digit number

Lesson 2: comparing numbers within 100 on a number line

Lesson 3: comparing 2-digit numbers

Lesson 4: ordering numbers within 100

Challenge: Making numbers in different ways.

Choose a number from 1-100 and see how many different ways you can make that number.

E.g. 20 + 4 = 24 14 + 10 = 24 ...

Mental fluency:

Log onto <u>TT Rock Stars</u> and go onto garage mode to practise your times tables.

Irresistible Learning: (Out of Eggs)

This term we are starting our new topic 'Out of Eggs'. This topics helps us to explore animals and their habitats.

Science: This week we are looking at whether something is living or not. Animals and plants are living things. Some things may have been alive at one time but are no longer living. Use this <u>link</u> to explore this.

Task: make a table with living things and nonliving things at the top. Can you draw and write some things for each of these categories? Can you think of any things which were alive once but aren't anymore?

Extra writing challenge: Watch the story <u>Croc and Bird</u> being read by Alexis Deacon the author. Can you write some sentences about how the croc and bird are the same and how they are different?

Phonics/ SPaG:

This week we are looking at the alternative **'ow' sound** and **'ie' sound**. **'ow'** can be said as **'oa'** like in **snow** and **rowing 'ie'** can be said as **'ee'** like in **brief** and **priest** Can you think of any other words that use these alternative sounds?

Reading:

Log onto <u>bug club</u> and explore the books you have been allocated. Here is something you could think about related to **sequencing**: Use three sentence to describe the beginning, middle and end of the story.
