## Maths

This week we will be looking at telling the time. Complete lessons 1-5 from Oak Academy.

**Lesson 1:** Understanding that clocks have more than one scale


**Lesson 2** Reading analogue time to the nearest minute

## Fluency:



Keep practising your multiplication and division facts. Use <u>hit</u> the button to help

The best way to tell the time is to do it every day, so check using a clock throughout the day. What time do you have lunch? What time will it be in 2 hours? How long until my bedtime? The more that you tell the time the easier it will become.

#### **Irresistible Learning:**

**History**: We are continuing to learn about prehistoric creatures. Have a look at the PowerPoint all about prehistoric creatures which is set as a 2Do. Then have a go at creating a set of top trump cards using the animal facts you have read about, a template has been uploaded as a 2Do task. You could even invent your own prehistoric animal to use. Check your 2dos and read chapter 6 of 'The Settlers' then answer the multiple-choice questions. This task can also be found in Purple Mash-topic-Stone age-settlers

**Science:** We are learning about different types of rocks. Watch this <u>video clip about rocks</u> then you could make a mind map about what you know about rocks. There is a 2Do task set so you can look and explore different types of rocks, then your work can be added on to our display board.

**Art**: You could make your favourite book character using a wooden spoon or out of a potato. Have a look at some of these <u>ideas</u> to get you inspired. You could use a shoe box to create a scene from one of your favourite books or a story in a jar.

## **English**

Oak Academy: This week we will complete the unit on Explanation texts called 'How

Bees Make Honey' (lessons 6-10) Complete a new lesson every day.

## Writing challenge:

What is your favourite book or story? Can you retell the story in your own words? You could write your own story using your favourite book character, where will they visit and what will happen to them? For example Paddington could visit Willy Wonka's chocolate factory. You could combine two of your favourite stories and characters and write what happens. If you like comics you could create your own comic character and tell a story using a comic strip. Have fun using ideas from your favourite books and see what you can create. We have been working a lot on screens so have a go writing your ideas onto paper, you could always send us a photo of your writing using 2Email. Phonics/ SPaG: this week we will be looking at the suffix —tion. Check your 2Dos for the spelling list and a quiz to complete.

**Reading**: Take time out to enjoy reading some of your favourite stories, comics, poems or non-fiction books and celebrate the love of reading.

To celebrate World Book Day, you might want to create a hat to represent your favourite character, story or book.
